**Pick-up Policy:** Due to our limited kennel capacity, it is very important that you pick up your pet(s) on or before the final day of your reservation. If you cannot pick-up your pet before closing, please book an additional day. Pets not picked up by the end of their reservation will be charged the additional daily fees.

**Examination Policy:** If your pet is in need of a vaccination, has not been examined by one of our doctors in the past 12 months, or needs treatment while boarding, you may incur additional charges.

**Vaccination Policy:** To ensure the safest stay for all of our boarders, we require all boarders be up-to-date on the following vaccinations:

Dogs: DA2PP, Bordetella, and Rabies

Cats: FVRCP and Rabies

**Medical Illness Policy:** If your pet(s) becomes ill or needs medical attention, one of our veterinarians will treat your pet. In cases of serious illness, we will make every effort to contact you or your local emergency contact before administering treatment. If neither of you can be reached, we will treat your pet as we would one of our own. The fees associated with such treatment will be your responsibility. In severe cases, we may elect to admit your pet for 24-hour care at Veterinary Specialty Center of Tucson, located at 4909 North La Canada Drive. Please take a moment to contemplate our medical policy, as we are firm in our commitment to the well-being of our boarders.

I have read and agree to the policies described above. I give Cortaro Farms Pet Hospital permission to update my pet's vaccinations as described above, and I agree to pay for those services. I understand and will comply with the medical policy described above. I intend to pick up my pet(s) promptly at the agreed upon time and will notify Cortaro Farms Pet Hospital if my plans change.
